South Omaha, April 22, 1903.
This week opened with about 3000 cattle here Monday, 5000 Tuesday and 3000 Wednesday, and a steady but slow market, averaging probably 15c lower than a week ago. Heavy receipts in Chicago has kept our market down but we hope to see a better market by the last of the week. Common cows and butcher stuff very slow sale.
