dangerous to attempt to drive on either section line for weeks at a time. Therefore we, the undersigned resident farmers, being legal voters and being obliged to cross the Elkhorn river at one of the above mentioned bridges to get to Stuart, at which place we get our mail, do most respectfully petition your honorable body and ask that you build us an additional bridge at this place to be located at the north east corner of section 11, as per diagram attached, said bridge to be a good substantial pile bridge 50 feet in length and 16-foot roadway. Signed by L. A. Jillson and 62 others.

On motion the prayer of the petition was granted and clerk instructed to advertise for bids for bridge. The following petition was read: To the Board of Commissioners Holt county, Neb. We, the undersigned electors residing within five miles of the following road south of O'Neill, ask that a bridge be built at a point north of present bridge on Elkhorn river to properly care for overflow during high water in the spring of each year, said bridge to be a pile and stringer bridge 60 feet in length.

Signed by P. J. Toohill and forty-two others. On motion the prayer of the petition was granted and the clerk instructed to advertise for bids for building said bridge.

Supervisor Keef asked for instructions in regard to repairing the bridge across Dry creek in Sheridan township.

On motion supervisor Keef was instructed to repair or rebuild said bridge according to his judgment for the best interests of the county.

The following petition was read. O'Neill, Neb. June 8, 1903. To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Holt county, Neb.

Gentlemen—The undersigned petitioner respectfully requests that you order the county treasurer to strike from the tax list the sum of \$17.62 assessed against lot 1, block 27, Bitney's addition for the year 1894 for the reason the assessor erroneously assessed this lot at \$115, whereas the lots adjoining were only assessed at \$20 each, which is a fair valuation; and your petitioner will ever pray.

The following petition was read. To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Holt county, Neb.

Gentlemen—We, your petitioners, crave that you locate and establish a bridge across Turkey creek on the line between the SW 1/4 of NW 1/4 and SE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of section 28, 33, 10, in Holt county, Neb.

The above mentioned location being about 1/2 mile farther down the creek from present site, the minor banks are high and a bridge can be constructed above high water with little cost and is also on the line, while in the present location the bridge is now washed out and impassable and on no line of subdivision of land; for this we respectfully ask.

Signed by C. E. Howe and others. On motion the prayer of the petition was granted and Supervisor Moler was instructed to move and repair said bridge.

On motion bridge warrant No. 21, issued to Edwards-Bradford Co., for \$35.88 on July 22, 1902, on bridge fund was cancelled for the reason that the claim for which the warrant was drawn was included in a prior claim.
