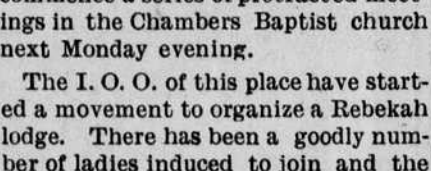
**ATKINSON.**
