Official: Publication: of: Proceeding

O'Neill, Neb. Sept. 19, 1904.—Board  
met at 1 o'clock p. m.  
Present Biglin, Grimes, Moler, Skid-  
more, Simar and Phillips.

Minutes of meeting of July 23 were  
read and approved.

The bond of M. Miller road overseer  
of district No. 6 was approved.  
On motion the prayer of Eugene Mc-  
Connell asking for a refund of taxes  
paid on 50 head of cattle be granted,  
they having been assessed in both  
Holt and Antelope counties in 1903,  
and clerk be instructed to draw a re-  
fund warrant for same and County  
Treasurer shall cause said tax to be  
stricken from tax list.

A refund of \$3 was granted James  
McShane he having paid same in  
labor on road in district No. 20 and also  
in cash to county treasurer.

On application of Joseph Kaplan for  
appraisal of the NW 1/4 of 16-29-15 su-  
pervisors Biglin, Simar and Skidmore  
were appointed to appraise the same.  
The application of Ralph D. Parson  
for admission to the Nebraska soldier  
and sailors home was granted.

On motion board adjourned to 9 a.  
m., September 20, 1904.

O'Neill, Neb. Sept. 20, 1904.—Board  
met at 9 o'clock a. m. All members  
present.

Motion made and carried that a  
committee of three members of the  
board be appointed to examine the  
proposed route of the Tomjack road  
as to section 32-26-10 and report at  
next session.

On motion the petition for a ditch  
in Stuart township was rejected for  
the reason that it was not legally pre-  
pared.

A refund of \$3 was granted William  
Kusel he having paid same in labor  
on road in district No. 16 and also in  
cash to the county treasurer.

The petition of A. C. Mann and 25  
others for a bridge across dry creek  
between sections 33 and 34-27-14 was  
granted and the county clerk instruct-  
ed to advertise for bids for construction  
of the same, said bridge to be a pile  
and stringer bridge 16 feet wide and  
24 feet long.

Motion made and carried that Super-  
visor Biglin shall cause to be remov-  
ed two bridges situated on the head  
of the Redbird creek in Gratton and  
have the sites filled with dirt or other  
material.

On motion board adjourned until  
10 o'clock p. m.  
One o'clock p. m. Sept. 20, 1904.—  
Board called to order, all members  
present.

shall be Meadow county be erected out  
of the following described territory  
to-wit: Commencing at the  
southwest corner of township 25 north  
of range 16 west; thence east to the  
southeast corner of township 25 north  
range 13 west; thence north along the  
range line between ranges 12 and 13  
west to the middle of the main chan-  
nel of the Niobrara river, thence up  
said channel to a point where the  
second guide meridian intersects the  
same; thence south along said second  
guide meridian to the place of begin-  
ning.

We further petition that the above  
proposition for the division of Holt  
county Nebraska and the erection of  
a new county to be named Meadow  
county be submitted to the voters of  
said Holt county Nebraska at the gen-  
eral election to be held in the year  
of 1904.

certified copy of the abstract of said  
vote made by the county clerk of Holt  
county, Neb. and hereto attached,  
and that the petition filed on Septem-  
ber 17, 1904 with the county clerk  
of Holt county, Neb. contains the  
names of 880 legal voters in the said  
territory to be so cut off and erected  
into Meadow county, and that said
