Will Cut Pay Rolls.

Lincoln Star: Expenditures at state institutions are to be reduced far below any previous mark under the next administration of Governor Mickey, and the salary role is to be chopped extensively by the lopping off of all but absolutely needed employes.

The governor proposes to cut down the expenses of the institutions as much as possible and with that object in view will start in a few days on a personal visit of inspection. He will examine into actual conditions, will learn what employes are needed and which ones can be dispensed with, and then will "lay off" all but those needed to run the institution in a proper manner and without discomfort to the inmates. There will be few changes in the heads of the institution, according to an announcement made by the governor this morning, as nearly all of the superientendents have given satisfaction and have conducted the work under them in an efficient manner.
