O'Neill, Neb., Jan. 19, 1906.—Board called to order at 9 o'clock a. m., present: Biglin, Clark, Kramer, Keys, Root and Skidmore.

Board went into committee of the whole with Conrad Kramer in the chair for the purpose of settlement.

At 12 o'clock m. the committee arose at which time the board adjourned until one o'clock p. m.

One o'clock p. m., board called to order in regular session, C. Kramer was chosen chairman pro tem.

On motion the following bonds were approved:

G. A. Davis, justice of Peace, Conley township.

Doran Hunt, justice of Peace, Verdigris township.

E. D. Henry, township clerk, Willowdale

James D. Beck, road overseer, dist. No. 44.

On motion a refund warrant was granted to Chas. Johnson in the amount of \$3.

Petition was read from Atkinson township asking that Frank G. Weller be appointed constable.

On motion the petition was granted.

The following resolution was read: Mr. Chairman.—I move you that the county attorney be requested by this board to at once examine all bank bonds and bids on file for the depositing of county money and that he give this board his opinion in writing within five days as to their legality and if in his opinion the bonds are legal. Also that he advise us by his opinion in writing whether or not the board has the legal right to disregard the bids now on file and solicit bids from banks outside of the county that are not public depositories in their respective counties, that will pay at least three per cent interest on county deposits.

On motion the resolution was adopted.

The following resolution was read: Mr. Chairman.—I move you that the county clerk be instructed to at once ascertain the rate of interest paid by the banks on county deposits in adjoining counties, and in the counties along the Northwestern railroad as far east as Madison county and as far west as Dawes county and report to this board at once.

On motion the resolution was adopted.

The following resolution was read: Mr. Chairman.—I move you that C. Kramer, C. D. Keys and Rodell Root be appointed a committee to confer with the banks of this county in the matter of interest on county deposits and that if the committee find that the banks of the county will not pay at least three per cent on county deposits, then that the committee be empowered to solicit bids outside the county for the county

money from banks that are not public depositories in their respective counties. L. E. Skidmore.

On motion the resolution was adopted.

On motion L. E. Skidmore was added to the committee.

On motion the claim of Ed F. Gallagher for \$333, the amount of the bond of the county treasurer was allowed.
