The Salts in the Ocean.

The salts of the sea have fed throughout all time countless living things which have thronged its water and whose remains now form the rocks of continents or lie spread in beds of unknown thickness over 68,000,000 square miles of the 143,000,000 square miles of the ocean's floor. They have lent the substance to build the fringing reefs of the land and all the coral islands of the sea, and there are at present on the basis of an average salinity of 3 1/2 per cent in the 290,700,000 cubic miles of water which make up the ocean's 90,000,000,000,000,000 tons, or 10,173,000 cubic miles, of salt. This is sufficient to cover the areas of all the lands of the earth with a uniform layer of salt to a depth of 1,000 feet.
