

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the state of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the state of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 6, A. D. 1906. Be it enacted by the legislature of

the state of Nebraska: Section 1. That at the general elec-tion for state and legislative offices to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the tirst Monday in November, 1906, the following provision be proposed and submitted to the electors of the state as an amendment to the constitution. Section 2. There shall be a state members, who shall first be elected at

for six years, the next highest four years, and the lowest two years. The powers and duties of such com-mission shall include the regulation provision.

Section 3. That at said election in the year 1906, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words, "For Constitutional Amendment, with ref-erence to State Railway Commission"; and, "Against Constitutional Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission." And if a majority of all votes cast at said election shall be

for such amendment, the same shall be deemed to be adopted. I, A. Galusha, secretary of state of the state of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution of the state of Nebraska, is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill, as passed by the twenty-ninth session of the legislature of the state of Nebraska, as appears from said original bill on file in this office, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the state of Nebraska for their adopt-ion or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 6th day of to be held on Tuesday, the 6th day of November, A. D. 1906.
