

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the state of Ne-braska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the state of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 6, A. D. 1906.

Be it enacted by the legislature of the state of Nebraska:

Section 1. That at the general election for state and legislative offices to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1906, the following provision be proposed and submitted to the electors of the state as an amendment to the constitution. Section 2. There shall be a state railway commission consisting of three

elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall hold his office for six years, the next highest four years, and the lowest two years. 1902, said cross petitioner alleging The powers and duties of such com-that he is the owner of said mortgage mission shall include the regulation mission shall include the regulation of rates, service and general control of common carriers as the legislature may provide by law. But in the absence of specific legislation, the commission shall exercise the powers and perform the duties enumerated in this provision.

Section 3. That at said election in the year 1906, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words, "For Constitutional Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission' and, "Against Constitutional Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission." And if a majority of all votes cast at said election shall be for such amendment, the same shall be deemed to be adopted.


