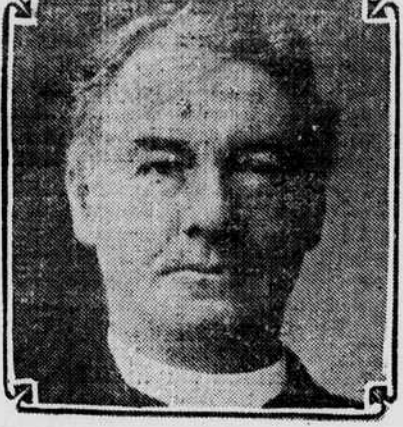

CAREER OF CAVALIERI.
 Beautiful Cantatrice Was Not Contented to Remain a Music Hall Singer.

Lina Cavalieri, who made a pronounced hit as a member of Heinrich Conried's Metropolitan Opera company the past season, was heralded as a great beauty before her advent on American shores. Some years ago she was known as "the most beautiful girl in Venice." A little later they called her in Paris "the most beautiful woman in Europe." When she stepped ashore at New York with Manager Conried last autumn, he enthusiastically declared her to be "the most beautiful woman in the world."
