enable young persons who wish to teach to prepare to do so by entering cement work neatly and promptly a school near home, where they will done. Address, Atkinson or O'Neill receive the best of instruction and where every opportunity is offered by which they may prepare for the work of teaching, as the law requires.

The law relative to Normal Training in the High Schools of Nebraska is very brief, yet comprehensive. It was enacted by the Legislature of 1905.

"On and after September 1, 1907, no person shall be granted a first grade county certificate who has not had at least twelve weeks normal training in a college, university or normal school of approved standing in this or in another state, or in a state junior normal school of Nebraska, or in a store or at residence 1 block north and 3 east of stand pipe Phones: Office 41, res. high, school of Nebraska approved by the state superintendent of public instruction as being equipped to give such normal training. 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
