NEBRASKA GOES DEMOCRATIC Gives Bryan Sinall Majority, With erger in the Lead for
Governor.
Returns from Tuesday's election convey the infermation that Mr. Taft carries the country for president and will have probably 300 electorial votes, or fifty-eight more than necessary for election.
It was a quiet election day in $0^{\prime}$ Neill although the usual vote was polled. The returns for the town- 62 majority or Bryan-inspired at "peerlega" and their plans for a ratification when the news would come over the wire of his election were afready latd and the men who had climbed onto the band wagon at the ele renth hour to be in ine for the pie counter were ready to hout the loudest, while the pent-up onthusiasm of their sons and daughtofs could not be suppressed and they Ing for the hurdred thousand-dollar
"commoner."
But conateraation relgaed among York came that that state was rafe for Taft by 100,000 plarality. Then all the New England states, Pennsyvania, Ohio, Indiana, West Vingicis, nesota, Iows, the Dakotas, Kansas and Pacific coast states came in with 75,000.
At republican headquarters it the telephone aomb had exploded in that Nebraska had gone demoeratie, with the probable defeat of the whole epublican state ticket.
Holt county went with the general emocratic land slide in the state. F. H. Whelan is re-elected county attorrbout a very small majority, probably uperviog. J. A Golden is re-elected Grimes, in the O'Nelll district, nman diemocrat, in the Chambershe First district, Nison, democrat, in coan, in the Seventh district. Incomplete returns from the Sixth congressional district indicate the relection of Kinkaid. Boyd, repubil can, was defeated for congress by Latta, democrat, in the Third district and Hitchcock, demoorat, was re-
elected in the Second. The other ongressional districts went repubFran.
Frank Phillips, republican, was deeated by J. A. Denohoe, fusion, for tate sellator in this district, and the Henry and wilburn, apelented. A complete tabulated stectem. the vote in this county will appear in the next issue of this paper.
