Your petitioner respectfully represents to your honorable body, that the southwest quarter of section twenty-one (21), in township thirty-two (32), north of range nine (9), is cheap grazing land situated in the northwest portion of Steel Creek township.

That the taxes on said described land have remained unpaid for 16 years last past, and that said taxes now amount to something over the sum of \$250. That said land stood assessed in the name of Leighton Wynn.

That on the 22nd day of September, 1899, the county of Holt commenced an action for the foreclosure of a portion of said taxes, and said action was commenced against Leighton Wynn, and that costs have accrued in said action amounting to something like \$75.00, including printers fees; that the court has never acquired jurisdiction in said action either over the lands or the owners thereof, and that the costs that have been made in said action are not a charge against the said land. That at the time of the commencement of said action Leighton Wynn

was deceased and said land was owned by his heirs.

Your petitioner now stands ready to pay all of the taxes, interest and advertising fees, due on said land, if the county will dismiss said action and pay said costs, and therefore prays your honorable body to make an order directing the county attorney of said county to dismiss said action at the costs of the plaintiff, upon the payment to the county treasurer by your petitioner of all the taxes, interest and advertising fees that may be due thereon.

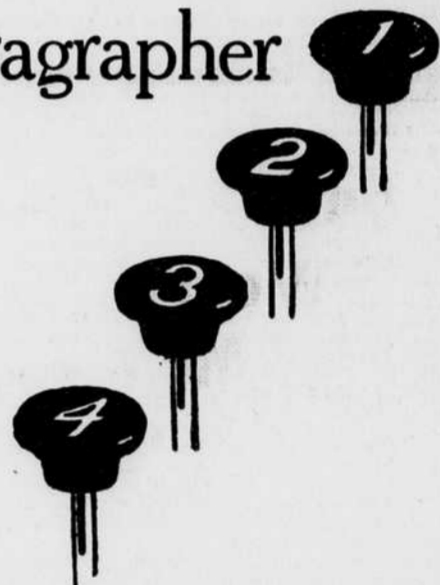
