### Death of Mrs. Sullivan.

Mrs. Mary Sullivan, one of the pioneer residents of this vicinity and county, died at her home in this city last Tuesday morning after an iliness of three weeks of creeping parlysis.

Mary Sullivan was born at Castleton, Barehoven county Cork, Ireland, in 1844, and was 66 years of age at the time of her death. They lived in Calumet until the spring of 1877 when the family moved to this county and took a farm one mile north of this city where they resided until the death of Mr. Sullivan three years ago when they moved to this

Deceased was the mother of ten children, six of whom are living to mourn the death of a kind and loving mother. The children are: Phillip, of Diamondville, Wyo., John, Jerry and Eugene of Butte, Mont., and Danial of San Francisco, Cal., and Miss Mary of this city. 
