ROAD PETITION.

To the honorable board of Holt county, Nebraska.

We, the undersigned being owners of land adjacent to proposed road hereby petition your honorable body to grant and establish a road described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the southeast corner of section 16, and running north two miles and a half to the section corner between section four and five, all in township thirty two range eleven west of the sixth p. m. thence in a northerly direction on the line of the present traveled road then north or northeast to township line and we further ask that the portion of road 42 running north from the half section line corner between section four and five be discontinued. If the road be established as above described we relinquish and waive all claim for damages, except for the amount set opposite to our names, which sum we agree to accept in full satisfaction for all damage to our respective land as follows: Henry S. 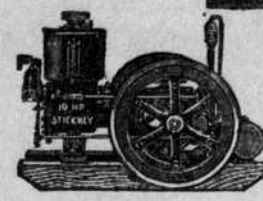
Opportunity Items.

Still dry but keep on plowing corn.

Corn is still holding its own but needs rain badly.

On the evenings of the 24th, and 25th, of last month lightning struck the prairie several times setting it on fire. The 24th it struck about four times east of the Geo. Reichert's place, and the fire started by it burned a strip six miles long before it could be stopped. Another fire was started the same evening on Joe Feslers place but was soon put out. Neither fire done any damage beyond burning some grass that was needed for hay. On the 25th lightning struck our hog meadow setting fire to it, and a spot 30 by 20 feet was burned. A small shower of rain put it out before it could make head way. Only a quarter of an inch of rain fell, but it is the most we have had at any one one time during the month, it freshened things up a bit, but we need a good big rain.
