The voting shall be by shares, each share being entitled to one vote which shall be cast by the owner thereof or his proxy. The directors shall hold their office for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VIII.  
At all meetings of the stockholders of this corporation, a majority of the paid up capital stock, and at all directors' meetings, a majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but by a majority vote of the stock represented, or of the members of the board of directors present, the stockholders' or directors' meetings may be adjourned from time to time. Special meetings of the board of directors may be called at any time by the president, vice president or cashier and special meetings of the stockholders may be called at any time on giving ten days written notice to stockholders of record by the president, vice president, cashier or by stockholders representing a majority of the paid up capital stock.
