Supervisors Proceedings. (Continued from last week.)

Mr. Chairman: I move that the petition of M L Erb and others be granted, same being a consent road, and the county surveyor be and is hereby instructed to plat same.

Motion carried. To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska.

We, the undersigned electors of O'Neill and Grattan township, Holt county, Nebraska and residing within five miles of the road hereinafter designated most respectfully represent that the section line between section thirty-one, township twenty-nine, range eleven and section thirty-six, township twenty-nine, range twelve in Holt county, Nebraska has never been condemned or legally established as a public high-way.

John J Kelly and twenty others. Petition asking for the vacation of road herein described having been filed. I now move that we declare the same vacated as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the northwest corner of section 31, twp 29, range 11, west, running thence south one mile on section line.

To M F Norton, County Surveyor: You are hereby notified that you have this day been appointed a commissioner to view, and if in your opinion the public good requires to locate a County road, petitioned for by Frank Jutte, William Jutte and others, and to be called road ... and described as follows:

Commencing at the northwest corner of section 31, twp 27, north of range 12, west of the 6th principal meridian and running thence east on the section line six miles to the north east corner of section 36, twp 27, range 12, west and there terminate.

You will therefore proceed to commence the examination of the route above described, and if in your opinion the public good requires it, you will call to your assistance the necessary aid, and proceed to lay out and mark the same according to law, and report to the county clerk of said County within twenty days after the com-

pletion of said survey. Given under my hand and seal this 24 day of June, 1912.

Board met pursuant to adjournment all members present. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. To the Honorable Board of Supervisors Holt County, Nebraska.

Ambrose M Holmes, your petitioner respectfully sheweth to your honorable body that he is the owner of the south west quarter of section 28, in township 28 north, of range 14, west of the 6th p. m. in Holt County, Nebraska.

Said land being my homestead and the patent for said land to me was issued on April 11th 1910 and said land was not subject to taxation for the year 1889 to 1908 inclusive, but through clerical error, said land has been taxed for each of the above years and an erroneous tax deed was issued for said land for the years 1889 1890 and 1891.

Whereas your petitioner prays that your honorable body redeem said land from said erroneous tax deed and cancel the taxes upon the tax books for each and every year above named that you also instruct the county attorney to dismiss the tax foreclosure case entitled, the County of Holt vs Cynthia Rogers, et al, and that all the costs of said action be taxed to the County of Holt, the plaintiff in said action, as said action was brought on illegal taxes, said action was commenced on or about September 22, 1899.

Your petitioner further states that he has paid the taxes upon the above described land for the year, 1909, 1910 and 1911. These being the only years that said land was legally taxed upon.
