Her death was an occasion of sorrow to a host of friends she had made in life, principally among the older settlers of the community, who oft had shared her comforting benevolence and hospitality.

No doubt many of us will feel her demise as a certain loss, during the short time we shall remain behind on the journey she has departed, but our memory will never fail us in recalling her many virtues.

The Hessian Fly.

During the past three weeks the presence of the Hessian fly in the wheat has been the cause of much interest among the farmers of southeastern Nebraska, and in some localities much anxiety has been felt as to the outcome of the attack. The affected area extends from Richardson and Nemaha counties north to the Platte River and west to Kearney County, but the serious injury is practically confined to the extreme southeastern counties. When the injury first began to become quite obvious, the vast majority of insects had already attained the fully grown larval or even the flaxseed (puparium) stage, which meant that the absorption of the sap of the plant had practically ceased and that the insect would be no further active drain on the vitality of the plant. Some of the fields, however, were infested as high as 30 to 50 per cent, and these were left in a much weakened condition with a probability of serious loss by falling straws before harvest. Many such fields were plowed up and planted to corn. The great majority of the fields, however, are much more lightly attacked, and under favorable weather conditions give good promise of making a crop in spite of the fly attack. In order to avoid the Hessian fly this fall, the Nebraska College of Agriculture advises that the fields should be plowed early and deeply and subsequently cultivated to obtain a compact, well-pulverized seed bed and to keep the volunteer grain eradicated. The sowing should then be delayed until about October 10, and fields which have been in wheat for several successive seasons should be avoided, wherever practicable.
