general or local law, or may authorize them to be exercised by local governmental-boards or courts, in accordance with general statutory provision."

In our State I find no Constitutional restrictions upon the power of the legislature but on the other hand find in the section above referred to that the power is expressly given to the Ligislature to organize townships.

While the question in regard to the division of Saratoga township is not entirely free from doubt, yet I am of the opinion that section 985 above referred to which gives to the County Board of Commissioners the right and duty to subdivide precincts already established as occasion may require governs this question and your acts with reference thereto. While it is true this section is a direction to the Board of County Commissioners, yet section 1054 of the Revised Statutes for 1913 provides that "In the absence of any special provision governing the goard of supervisors as contemplated by this article, which board shall be governed by and perform all the duties and have all the powers applicable to county boards as provided by the general laws of the state" and Section 1077, Revised Statutes of 1913, provides, that "The duly elected and qualified supervisors of counties adopting the township supervisor system under the provisions of the three proceeding sections, shall be and constitute the county board of such county with like powers, duties and limitations as other county boards."

Therefore taking together sections 985 1054 and 1077, Revised Statutes 1913, above referred to it is my opinion that it is made the duty and is manda-
