Eighty-five Kansas murderers convicted and sentenced in the short space of two years ending June 30, 1916, as against twenty-nine in Nebraska in the same period! The appalling murder record of Kansas carries a lesson of terrible import to the citizens of Nebraska. Under prohibition there has grown up in Kansas the inevitable "Alley Joint" evil. In these "joints" liquors of the vilest sort are dispensed to men and boys by dissolute characters, both male and female, spreading crime and debauchery to every part of the state.

*** "Of the 166 criminal cases docketed for the September term of court, 106 are for violations of the prohibitory law. *** As a rule, about one-tenth of the cases brought charging violations of the prohibitory law are tried. They cost the county about \$50 each."

"One noticeable thing about the criminal docket for the September term is that forty-six of the JOINT cases are against women."

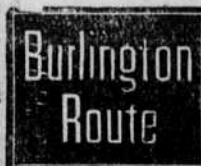
