Winter Care of Tires.

If an automobile is used occasionally during the winter, it will not be Abstract Company necessary to remove the tires, but they should be partially deflated, according to the department of agricultural engineering of the University of Nebraska. The wheels should be supported by jacks.

Tires should not be left standing on greasy or wet floors. Grease is injurious to the rubber and moisture to the fabric.

If the car is stored for the winter, it should be jacked up and the tires re-

moved. If there are any cuts in the rubber they should be repaired in order that moisture may not enter the During the winter, after the cas-

ings have been wrapped in paper or burlap to keep them as dry as possible and to protect them from the sunlight, they should be placed in a dry room with a temperature ranging between with a temperature ranging between 40 and 65 degrees.
