The agent says himself the farmers are capable of running their own affairs. So why should we pay him \$3600. 3600 Dollars is a lot of money for to charge for writing letters for the farmers. I will do what he is donig for the farmers free of charge. The state pays him \$1200 and that's all he is supposed to get. The county treasurer only gets \$2000 and it costs him pretty near that much to pay his bonds. Anytime any far-mer or anyone else has something to sell they can run their exchanges in my ads free of charge. Any time they want any letters of charge. Any time they want any letters written or vaccine ordered I will do it for them for nothing. There are only 300 work-ing days in the year and providing he worked half that time for the farmers it would figure a salary of \$24.00 per day. If the farmers gave me \$3600 a year I will earn it. 
