### SAMPLE BALLOT

### Special Election, August 2, 1920

Shall the City of O'Neill, in Holt County, Nebraska, issue its bonds in the sum of Thirty-one Thousand Dollars, in denominations of One Thousand Dollars each, dated January 1, 1921, due in Twenty years from their date, to draw interest at the rate of six per cent per annum payable annually; principal and interest payable at the fiscal agency of the State of Nebraska, in the City of New York; said bonds to be negotiable in form and to be designated as "O'Neill Water Bonds," the said bonds to be redeemable at the option of said City at any time after five years from their date. Said bonds to be sold for the purpose of obtaining money with which to purchase and install the following materials for the purpose of maintaining and extending the water works system now owned and operated by the City of O'Neill, to-wit:

- 1. A water storage tank having a capacity of 150,-000 gallons.
- 2. Ten fire hydrants.
- 3. Two thousand feet of four-inch water main.
- One thousand feet of eight-inch, cast-iron water
- One forty-horse power, kerosine and gasoline burning engine.
- The necessary ground on which to install said water storage tank. And shall the proper officers of said City be authorized to levy and collect taxes, in the same manner as other municipal taxes may be levied and collected, in an amount sufficient to create a sinking fund as required by law, and to pay the interest on said bonds and the principal of said bonds as the same mature, on all taxable property of said City. The taxes so levied not to exceed the amount authorized by law."
