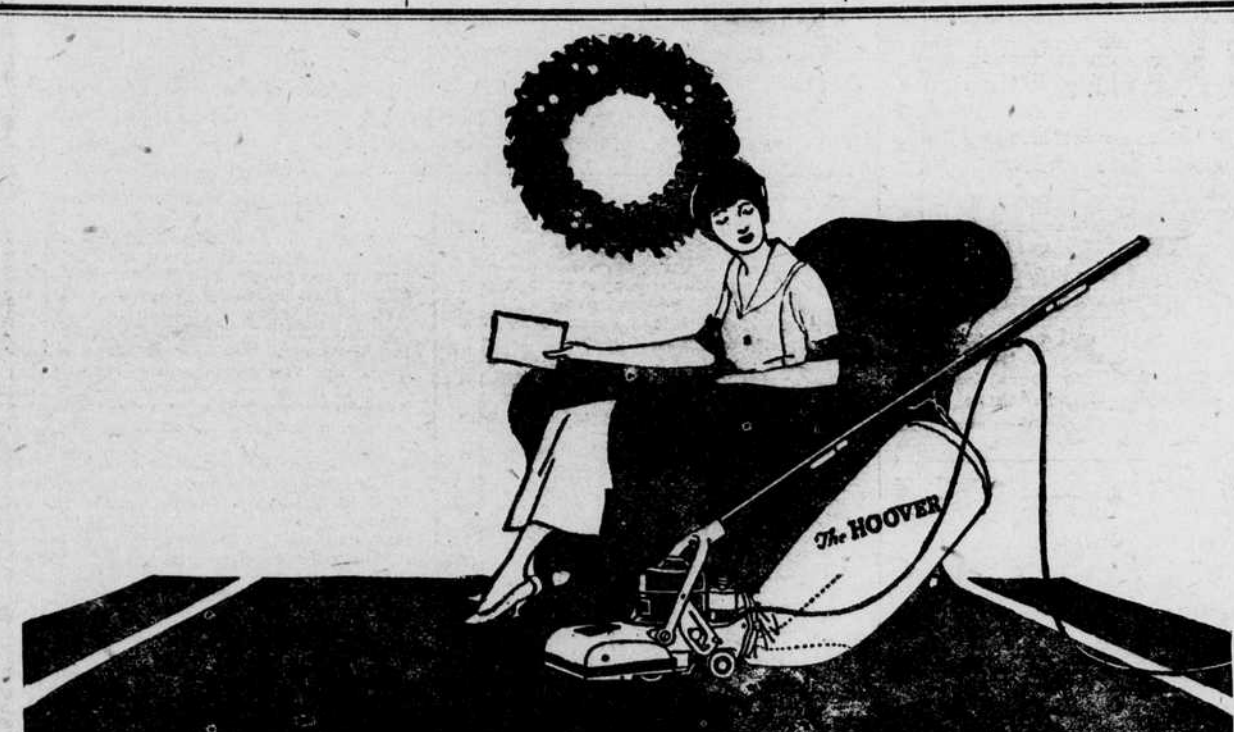
The Frontier joins the many friends of the family in tendering its condolences to the bereaved relatives in their hour of sorrow.
