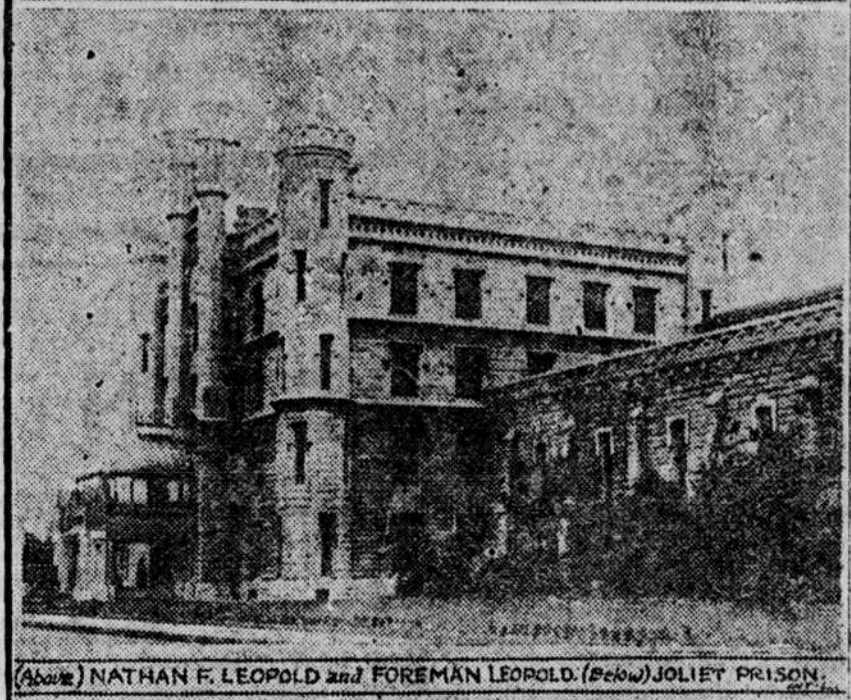

LEGION CHIEFS RAP PACIFISTS

Speakers At Convention Attack Pastors Who Opposed Defense Day

St. Paul, Sept. 15.—A movement to get Gen. John J. Pershing to head the American Legion for the next year was launched tonight by a group of veterans. The general has not been approached on this subject, it was stated.

St. Paul, Minn., Sept. 15.—Pacifist clergymen who attempted to obstruct the carrying out of the recent national defense test were bitterly denounced by speakers at the opening session of the American Legion convention here Monday.

National Commander John R. Quinn sounded the keynote of the attack on the pacifists. James T. Williams, Jr., Boston editor, brought a roar of applause when he denounced clerical interference in affairs of state.

Chaplain Rev. Ezra Clemens of Minnesota prayed: "Our Father, if Thou canst bless the pacifists, if Thou canst do nothing else for them, we pray that Thou make their hearts as soft as their heads."

Through efforts of the American Legion, congress and the Coolidge administration, the United States Veterans bureau has been "cleaned up" Brig. Gen. Frank T. Hines, head of the bureau, told the convention.

Speaking at the open meeting of the service organization's sixth annual convention, he declared the Veterans Bureau is being operated "efficiently and with a sympathetic and human treatment of the disabled." More than 40,000 Legionnaires are in attendance at the convocate.

Warns of Attacks
Stressing what has been done to rout the inefficiency which existed under the regime of Col. Charles R. Forbes, indicted former director, Hines warned his hearers that politicians will shortly launch new attacks against the bureau and urged the American Legion to help the bureau build up public confidence.

Hines plea followed closely on the speech of Capt. Watson B. Miller, Legion rehabilitation chief, who said great improvement has been noticeable in the bureau but that "there is room for still more."

In his address Hines took to task John W. Davis, democratic candidate for the presidency, for a statement attributed to the nominee in his Seagirt, N. J., speech of four weeks ago.

The paragraph of Davis' speech which Hines read to the convention was: "It is praised as one of the advances of the administration that \$40,000,000 have been appropriated to

GOVERNOR SAYS NEBRASKA "DRY" LAW IS ENFORCED

Lincoln, Neb., Sept. 15. (Special)—Governor Bryan said Monday that so far as he was able to learn, county attorneys of the state had been cooperating in the enforcement of the state prohibition law. The governor was discussing the complaint against County Attorney Funke of Knox county. The report from County Attorney Funke, he said, shows that in the past six months twelve complaints have been filed, twelve convictions secured, \$600 collected in fines, one case is pending, eighteen have been appealed, twenty five jail sentences have been imposed and five automobiles confiscated in that county.

Answers Charge.
"In answer the veterans bureau director said: "Consider the degree in which that gentleman was misinformed and the extent to which misinformation has been scattered all over the country. The truth is that with the \$40,000,000 referred to there has been provided more than 10,000 beds, of which over \$500 are actually occupied at the present time."

National Commander Quinn, in his address, stressed the need of conservation of natural resources and urged the Legion to get back of such a program.

Judge Kenesaw M. Landis and Gen. Charles G. Dawes, republican candidate for the vice presidency, will be in attendance at Tuesday's meeting.

The annual Legion parade will be a feature of Tuesday afternoon's program. Thirty thousand men with 100 bands will be in the line of march.

SLAYER OF WOMAN THROWS SELF ON MERCY OF COURT

Zupke was not represented by counsel when he was arraigned before Judge Charles E. White.

Judge White declared that he would hear testimony in the case before pronouncing sentence on Zupke, who is 24 years old.

THOUSANDS ASK LIVES OF TWO LADS BE SPARED

Petitions To Save Slayers of Policemen From Gallows Being Prepared

Chicago, Sept. 15.—More than 100,000 names will be represented on petitions that will go to Governor Small asking him to spare the lives of Bernard Grant and Walter Krauser.

The demand that the lives of Grant and Krauser be spared was made after Nathan Leopold, Jr., and Richard Loeb escaped the death penalty for slaying Robert Franks.

In some respects the two cases are parallel, in others they are as far apart as the moon and the sun. Grant and Krauser were implicated in the robbery of an outlying store, Saunders, the slain police officer, caught the robbers in the act. One of them—said to have been Krauser—held a pistol and the policeman was shot when he attempted to wrest it from the robber's hand.

Grant and Krauser are poor. Attorney Swanson undertook the defense of Grant while Attorney W. M. McEwen defended Krauser. The youths had no money to hire attorneys. Krauser had little education and it was shown that his mind was not strong—yet a jury decided he knew the difference between right and wrong and fixed the penalty at death. The same penalty was given in the case of Grant.

Grant's case went to the supreme court and the decision of the trial court was promptly affirmed and October 17 set as the date of the execution. The case of Krauser is still pending before the supreme court. Both defendants are under 21—Grant is 20 and Krauser 19 years old.

The appeal for executive clemency in the case of Grant is expected to be laid before Governor Small on Wednesday or Thursday of this week. Action in the case of Krauser may be delayed until the supreme court has passed on the case.

It is not believed Governor Small will reject the petition. He will probably commute the sentence to one of life imprisonment.

The petitions will be signed by scores of fraternal organizations and clubs, among them the Women's club and the American Legion.

The statement of Clarence Darrow that he believed Leopold and Loeb would go insane within five years was taken in some quarters as the laying of the foundation to secure the release of the prisoners as insane patients and send them to an asylum. But under the laws of Illinois this would help them little. Prisoners who go insane in the penitentiary are removed to the asylum, it is true. But the law says that if the patients regain their sanity they must be returned to the penitentiary and not liberated.

BANK ROBBERS ARE SENTENCED

Dakota Men Who Plead Guilty Get Seven Years Each

Aberdeen, S. D., Sept. 15.—(Special)—James Ryan, alias "St. Louis Billy," William Berg, formerly of Minot, N. D., and Ben Mahonwick, alias George Duane who last week confessed to a series of robberies, including the robbery of the Greenway, S. D., bank some time ago, Monday were taken to Leola where they had a preliminary hearing, and then to Faulkton, where they appeared before Judge Botum, pleaded guilty, and were sentenced to serve seven years each in the state penitentiary at Sioux Falls. The men will be taken to Sioux Falls Tuesday morning to begin serving their sentences.

Disagreement between state authorities and State Attorney Nord of Faulk county continued until the end. Mr. Nord refused to give ground in the state that he wanted to try one of the men for the robbery of the Onaka, S. D., bank. He refused to accept a plea of guilty but the other authorities, believing that the case against the men was not strong enough to risk a trial, took the men to Faulkton and had them plead and notified Mr. Nord that if he wanted to try one of them he would have to get him out of the penitentiary to do it.

W. H. Gordon, special officer for the South Dakota bankers association, who declared several days ago that one of the three men had told him that as soon as he had pleaded guilty and had received his sentence he would tell who shot and killed a policeman at Devils Lake, N. D., about six weeks ago, said that the man had kept his word and had given him a good tip to work on. He intended to confer soon with authorities from Devils Lake with a view to going after the murderer.

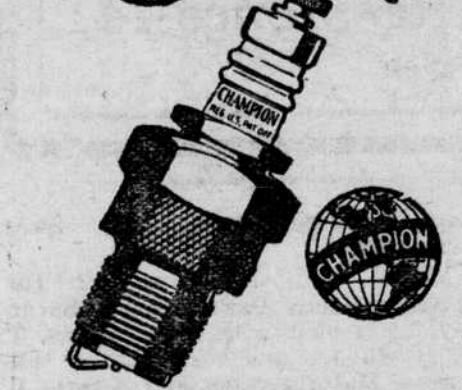
