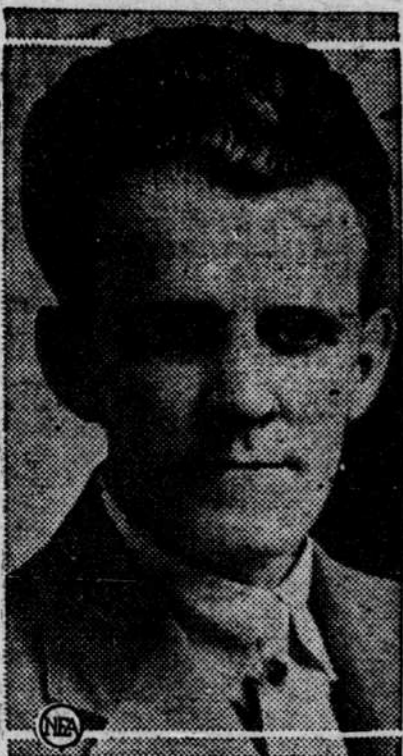


**Gets Inspiration Outdoors**

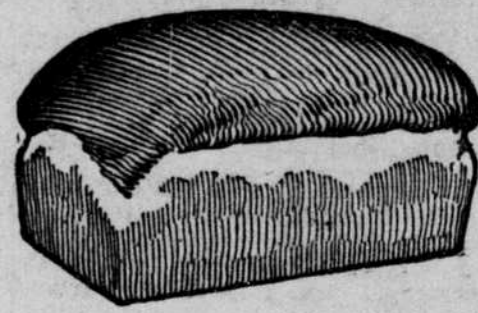
