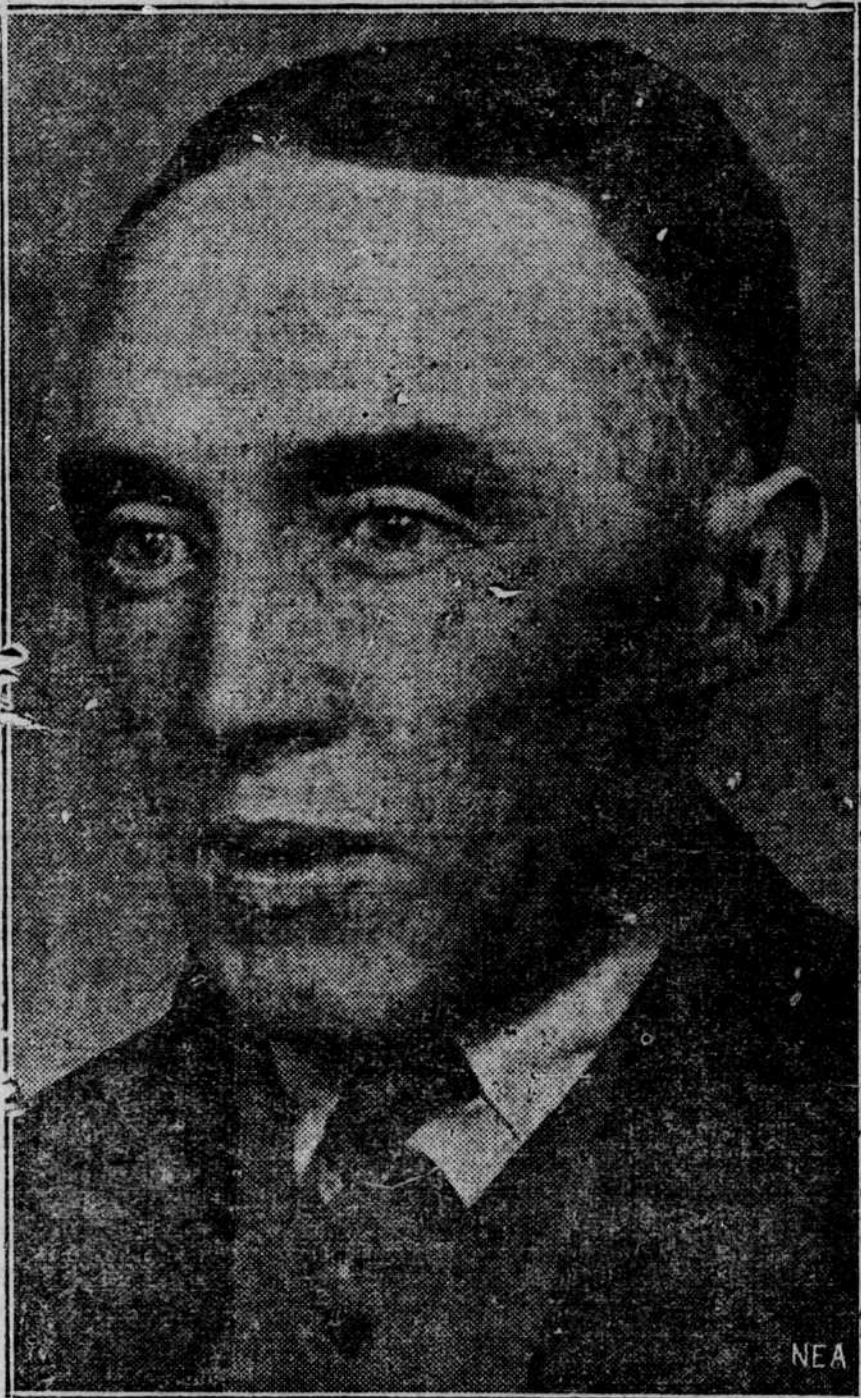


Will She Mary the Marchese?

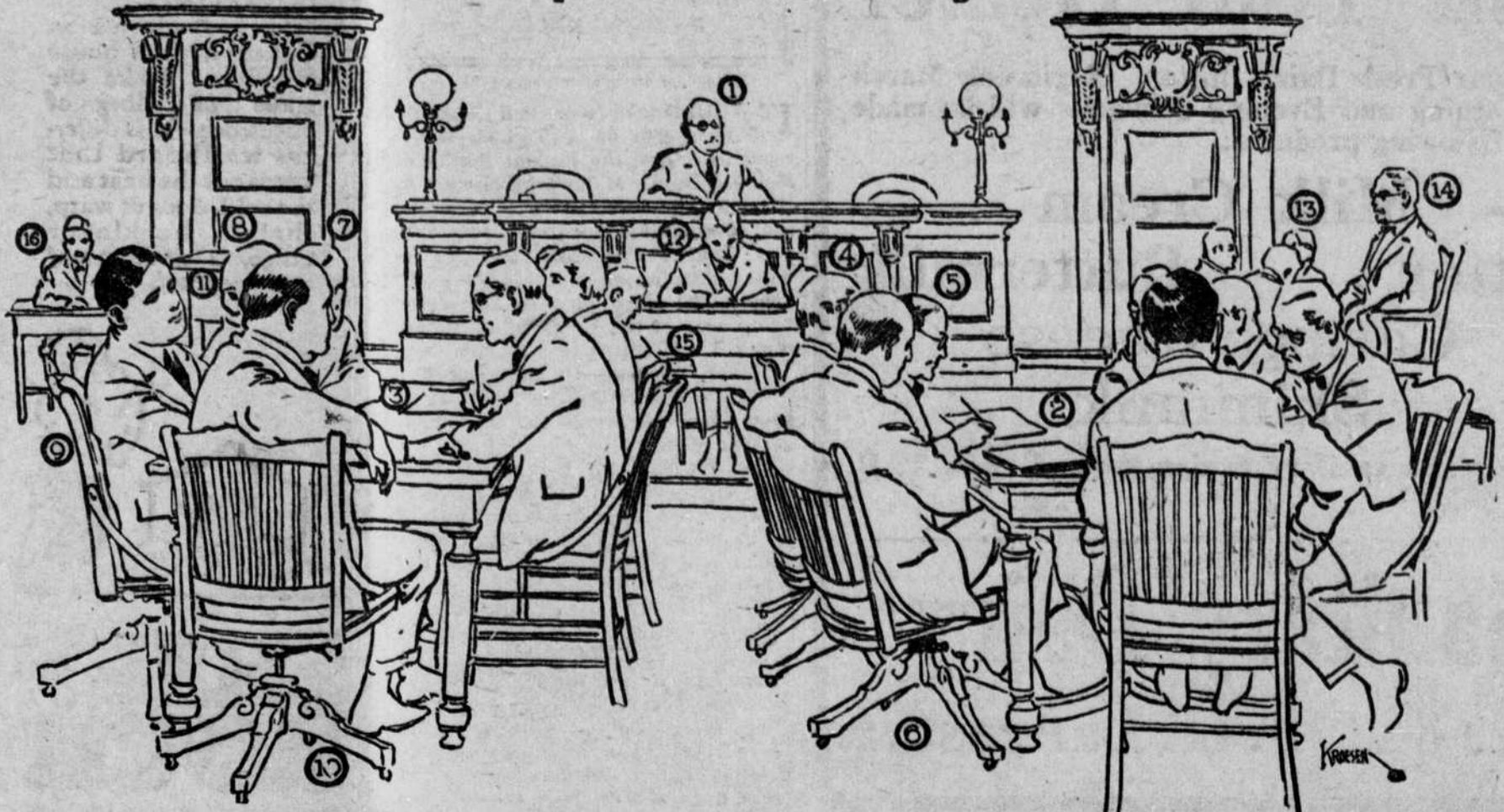
Body Exhumed

One of the impressive works submitted at the annual exhibit of the Independent Artists of America, was a painting entitled "The Tempest" by Harper R. Huner.

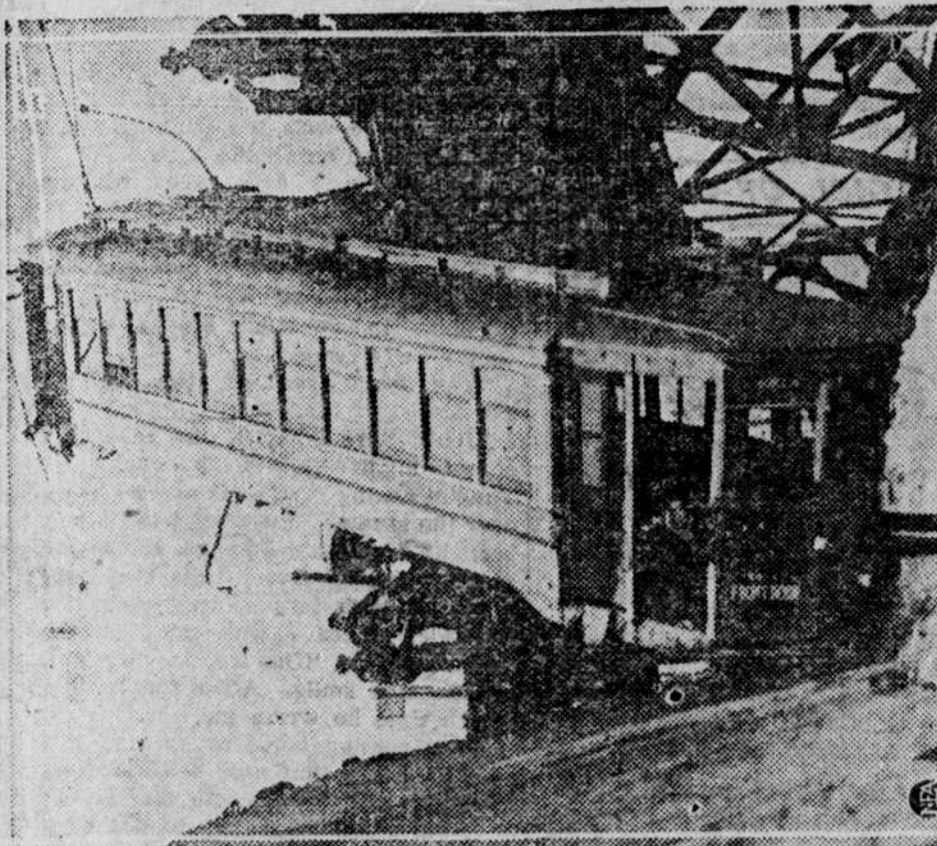
Accuse Father
