ORDINANCE NO. 98A.

An ordinance amending Section 11 of Ordinance No. 96A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, and repealing said Section 11 of Ordinance No. 96A as it now exists.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 11 of Ordinance No. 96A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, be, and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"Section 11. Any person transacting any of the businesses or carrying on the occupations hereinbefore set forth, without first paying the occupation tax herein provided for, shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, and shall be committed to the City jail of the City of O'Neill until the fine and costs are paid. For each day's failure to pay such occupation tax while any person is transacting any of the businesses or carrying on the occupations hereinbefore set forth, a penalty of one dollar per day shall be added to such tax and collected from the person transacting such business or carrying on such occupation. The City of O'Neill shall have the right to bring and maintain a civil action in the name of The State of Nebraska to recover the occupation tax herein provided and all penalties which may accrue by reason of the failure to pay such tax, and such action may be brought in any court of competent jurisdiction."

Section 2. That Section 11 of Ordinance No. 96A, as it now exists, be, and the same hereby is repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
