

"It is too bad I could not continue in the enforcement of prohibition and accomplish some good in upholding the constitution. But I could not do stool pigeon work for the government and I am now seeking another position to earn an honest living."

When Mr. Jackson decided he wanted to engage in law enforcement the prohibition unit welcomed him. A scion of such a distinguished Amercan as Old Hickory actively engaged in law enforcement work would be an inspiration, it was felt, to other young men of the country. Mr. Jackson had definite ideas concerning what should be done to bring about adequate respect for law. He went into the service with a clear understanding of the responsibilities

The young man, who lives in Loz Angeles, comes by his passion for law enforcement naturally. His father was an internal revenue officer who chased moonshiners in the mountains of Tennessee. Like his forbears, he has been a soldier. He was gassed in France.

The Largest Steam Boiler What is said to be the largest steam boiler in the world is now being installed in Pittsburgh, Pa., by a company which supplies heating service in the down-town business district. There are six miles of four-inch tuting in the heating and condensing tubes of this apparatus, with a heating surface of \$2,750 square feet, about three-fourths of an acre. The boiler is rated at \$,000-horsepower by the ordinary sysgrandsen of the hero of New Orleans ing continuously at three times this capacity and for short periods at four times this rate. When at full speed it evaporates 200 tons of water per hour.

> France Seeks Water Power Being dependent upon foreign sources for one-third of the coal consumed annually, the French government is turning its attention to the development of water power in France. About 9,000,000 horse power are available in the water resources of that country. Fuel deposits are relatively small, and 23,000,000 of the 72,000,000 tons of coal used yearly are imported.
