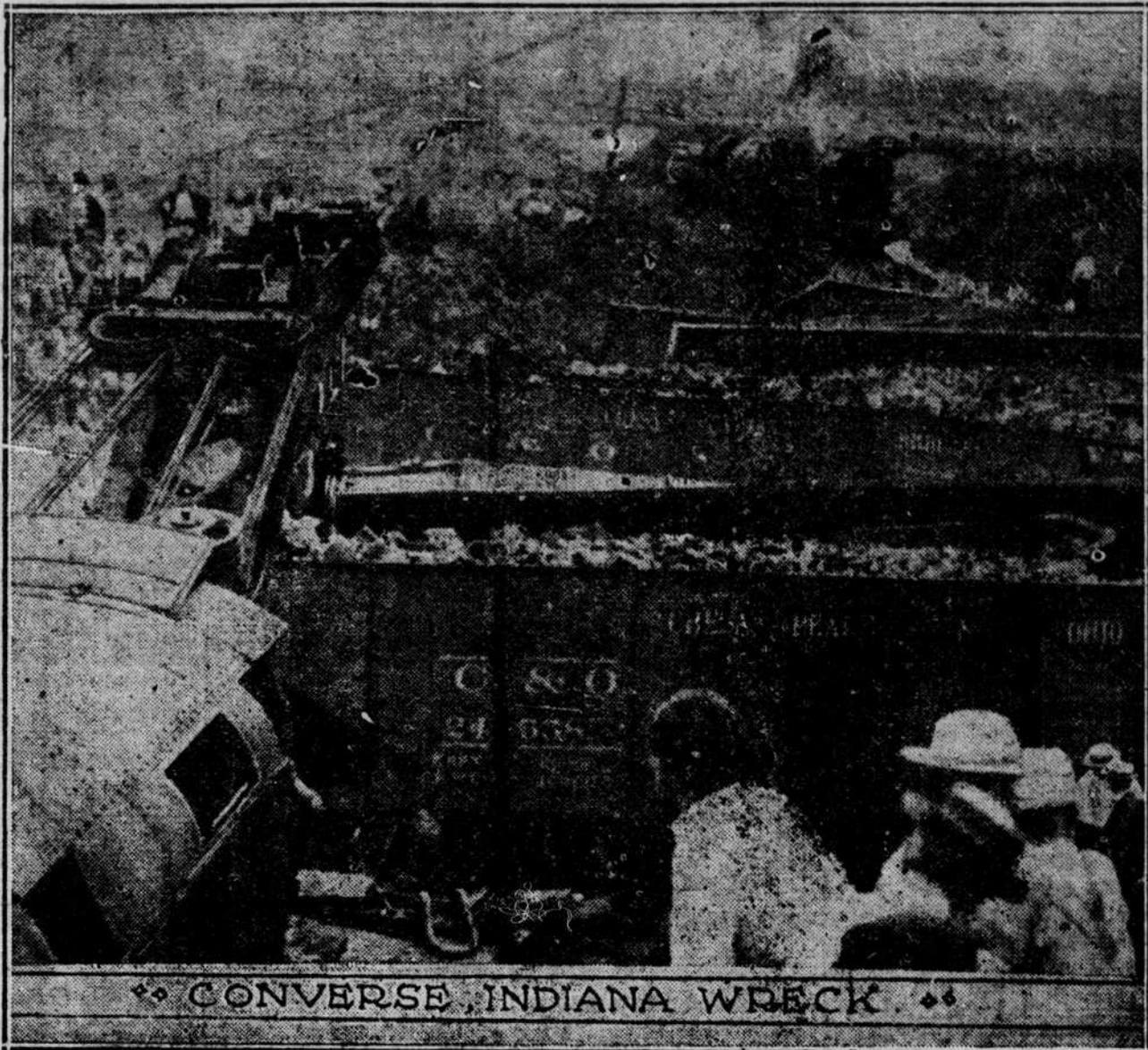


Wreck Kills Thirteen

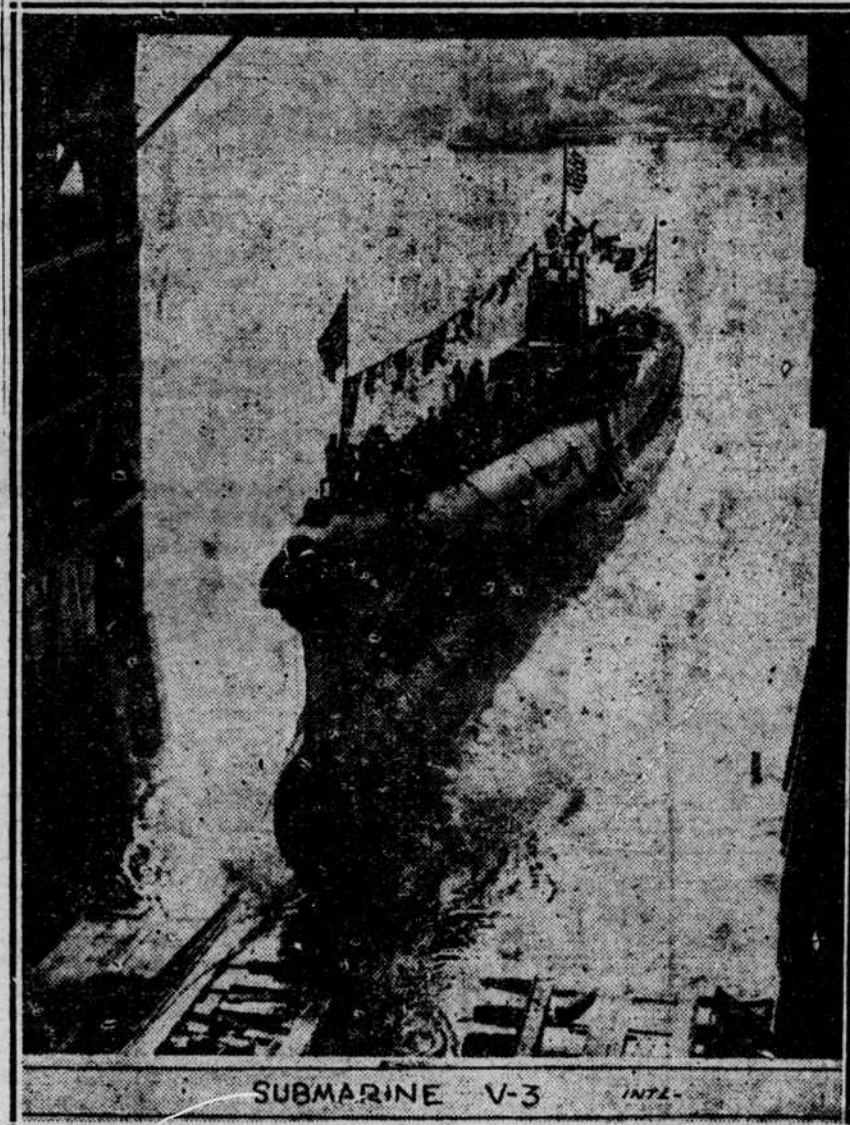
Mother an M. A.

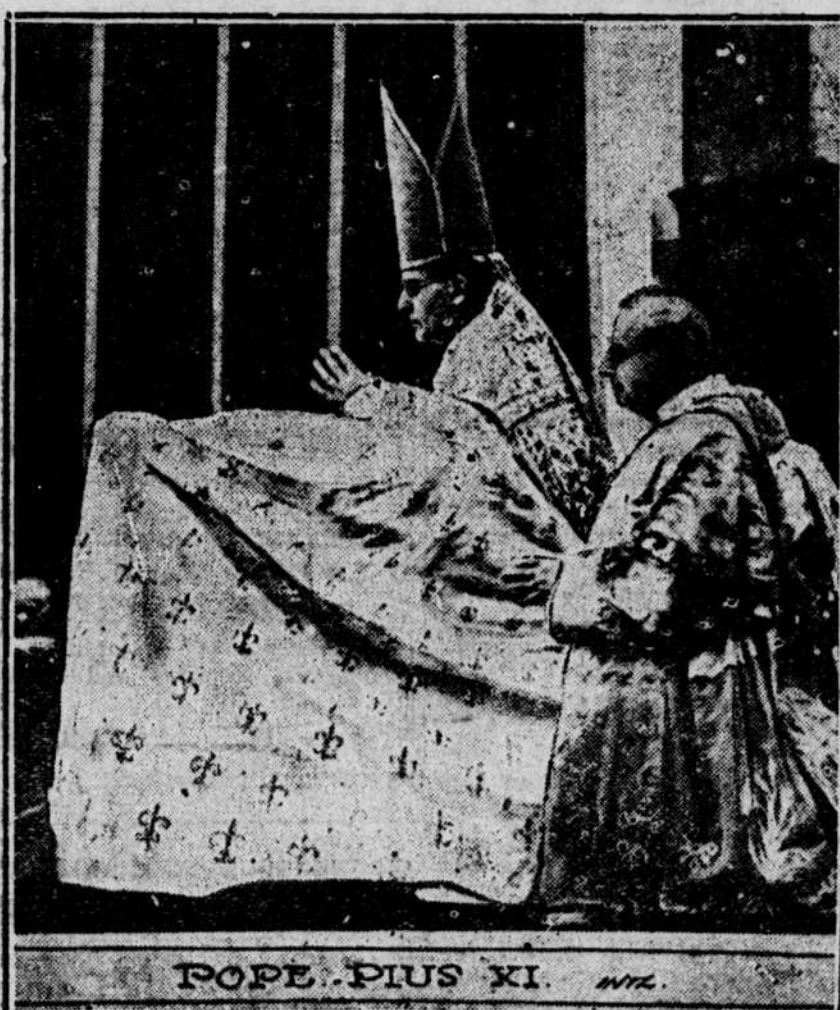
Marksman
