Public notice is hereby given that the Mayor and City Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, by resolution duly passed and entered in the minutes of a regular meeting of said Council held on the 4th day of August, 1925, in accordance with Article VI, Chapter 7 of the Compiled Statutes

of Nebraska for 1922, directed that public notice be given that an issue of valid, interest bearing bonds of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, dated January 1, 1921, in the principal sum of \$31,000 was voted and authorized to be issued at a special election held in said city on the 2nd day of August, 1920; and of which amount so issued there remains outstanding and unpaid the sum of \$19,000; and that there will be on hand in the sinking fund to pay said issue on January 1, 1926, not more than sufficient to pay \$1,000 of said bonds and the interest on the entire outstanding \$19,000 of said issue; and which issue bears interest at six per cent per annum; and the remaining unpaid \$19,000 of said issue will become optional for payment by said City on January 1, 1926; that to raise the balance of \$18,000 necessary to pay off and redeem said issue of bonds, which are known as "O'Neill Water Bonds," the City of O'Neill proposes to issue refunding bonds of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, in the principal sum of \$18,000, said bonds to be eighteen in number, in denominations of \$1,000 each, to be known and designated as "City of O'Neill Refunding Bonds, Series A," to be dated January 1, 1926, and to be due in twenty years from their date, to be numbered from 1 to 18, and to be optional for payment by said City as follows:
