WHEREAS, in the construction of the Federal State Highway Project 200, to comply with Federal State requirements and specifications it is necessary to acquire for said highway, the following described pieces of land belonging to, the following named persons, to-wit:

Wiseman tract:—In section 34-27-9 beginning at a point 33 ft. north of the southwest corner of section 35; thence 500 feet north on section line; thence 110 feet in a south-westerly direction to a point 49 feet west of section line; thence 357.6 ft. due south; thence 40 feet east to a point of beginning containing 40-100 (forty one-hundredths) of an acre.

Robert Archie tract:—Beginning at a point 33 feet north of southwest corner of section 35-27-9; thence due east 130 feet; thence in a south-westerly direction 315 feet to a point 33 feet east of section line; thence due south 327 feet; thence 33 feet west to point of beginning containing 8-10

(eight tenths) of an acre.
