Chicago bankers at the time pointed to the danger of excessive speculation in this country which would follow cheapening of the money rate, but their opinions were given no consideration. We are not prepared to say that the current wave of speculation can be explained solely by the lowering of the discount rate, but we are convinced that the lowering of the rate did give great impetus to the bull market and to that extent has served to direct money into a gamblers' market.

Suggest Mail Delivery By Fast Aerial Trolleys

Paris —Torpedo mail delivery at the rate of 250 miles an hour is said to be practicable by two French engineers, L. Hirschauer of the French Aeronautic service and A. Talou of the Southern Railroad of France.

They believe that urgent mail will one day be shot around France on overhead trolleys in small torpedoes propelled by electric motors.

They estimate that installation would involve an outlay of only 10 per cent. of the cost of a railway and that when traffic reached a volume of five tons a day each way on any line the profit on the investment would be 100 per cent.

German Finds Iodine In Milk of Wyk Cows

Emden, Germany —A valuable medicinal remedy in the form of iodized milk has been discovered by Dr. Gmelin, a physician in Wyk on Foehr Island in the North Sea.

Dr. Gmelin established the existence of from one fourteenth to one twenty third of a grain of iodine in the milk of cows and sheep grazing on the islands of the German west coast. Its presence is attributed to the powerful influence of the North Sea, noted for its emanations of large quantities of salt, radium and iodine, especially during low tide.
