Indebted to Early Spanish Settlers*

Many of Our Dance Rhythms Are of Early California Flavor

New York City.—One of the most unique theme songs ever heard with a motion picture is the song written for "Ramona," just filmed by Dolores Del Rio.

Miss Wayne who wrote the song "Ramona," has combined in it strains of pure Spanish of the days of forty-nine and the Indian and Spanish which is the idiom of the picture.

It is one of the few original theme songs ever written for a picture which is at the same time a popular tune.

Miss Wayne spent several months research on this music, and each theme tells its own story.

"To me, an American rhythm of Spanish idea is one of the most

"Of all the sources from which jazz is supposed to spring, I give most credence to that of it being the Indian's interpretation of those early Spanish songs rather than its descent from the slave songs of the South.

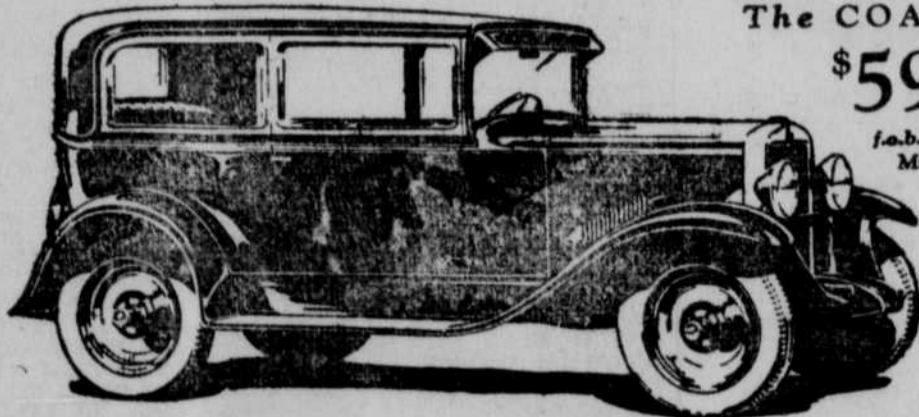
