

WHAT THE WORLD'S LARGEST AIRPLANE WILL LOOK LIKE

An artist's drawing of one of the four huge planes to be constructed by the General Development Company of Connecticut. The mammoth aerial giant, known as a "Flying Wing" monoplane will have a wing spread of 262 feet; over-all height of 31½ feet; total length of 138 ft; is powered with eight engines, each over 1,000 horsepower in two units of four, driving two 4-bladed 34-foot propellors. The plane is designed to carry 160 passengers luxuriously and a crew of 17. Maximum passenger capacity is 206 under U.S. Department of Commerce regulations. The plane is expected to develope a maximum speed of 145 miles per hour, and a low speed of 60 miles per hour.


