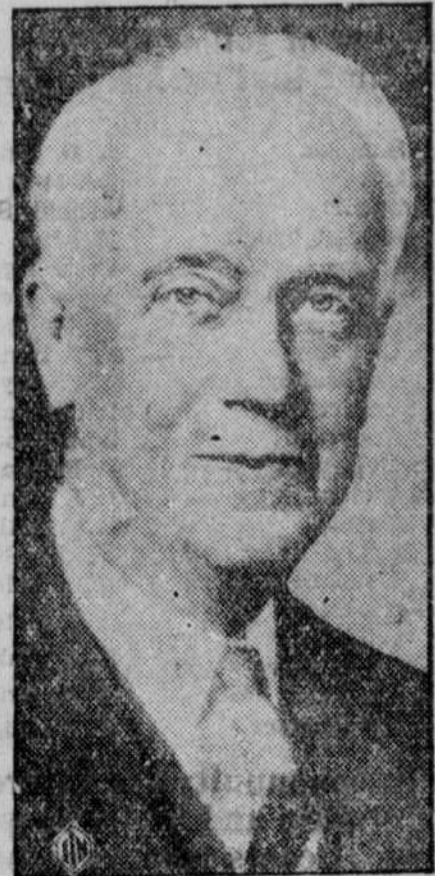
Wins High Honors at Military Academy

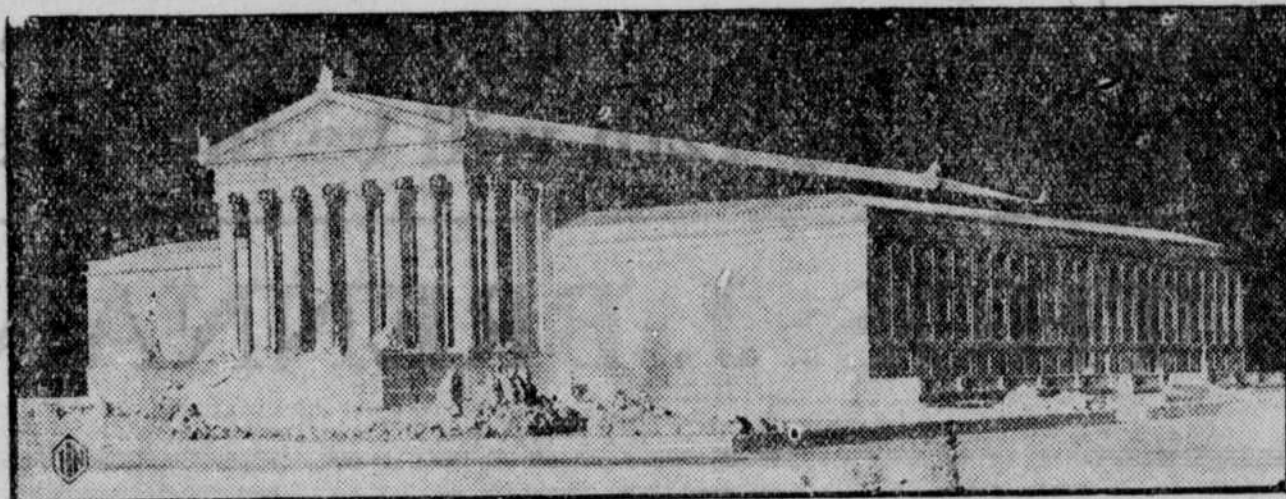
Hoover Selects Iowan As Minister to Canada

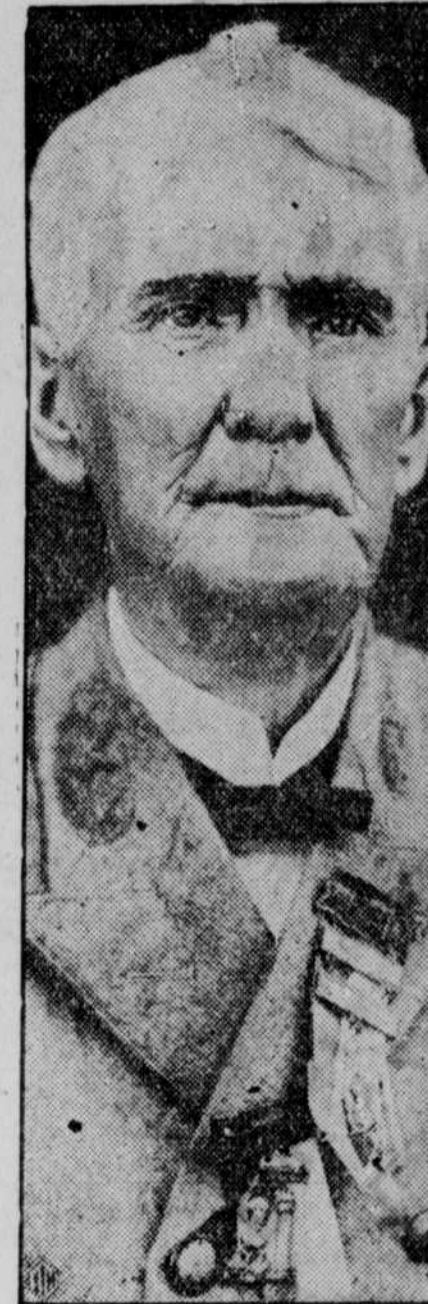
Professor Elected Head of N. C. University
