NEBRASKANA BOARD ENDORSES STATE FLAG

At a recent meeting of the Nebraska board of governors it was decided that the Nebraska Society will co-operate with other patriotic organizations in promoting a general distribution of Nebraska's state flag. The flag was designed by Mrs. B. G. Miller of Crete, and has been formally recognized by an act of the legislature.

The photograph which appears above contains the executive officers of the board of governors, who are, left to right: County Attorney Robert M. Baldwin of Hebron, editor; Dr. H.
