



Children should not be hurried. Time should be allowed for thorough 26.94 chewing of food so that the stomach won't be overtaxed.

Clean hands and face should be insisted upon at meal time, as dirty 45.00 hands are dangerous when carrying food to the mouth. Children shouldn't be forced to eat

when not hungry as it often creates a 35.36 dislike of those foods. Meal time should be happy without 10.00 too much excitement before, during or

22.00 after eating. At least a pint of milk should be 14.65 drunk by the children every day. If he can't drink it alone it should be 10.00 given in the form of cocoa, custard, milk soups, etc. Dried or evaporated

milk may be used if it is impossible to get anything else. Dr. Graham Lusk says: "No family of five should buy meat until they have bought 2.49 three quarts of milk.




