

"Typifying the Modern Motor Car"

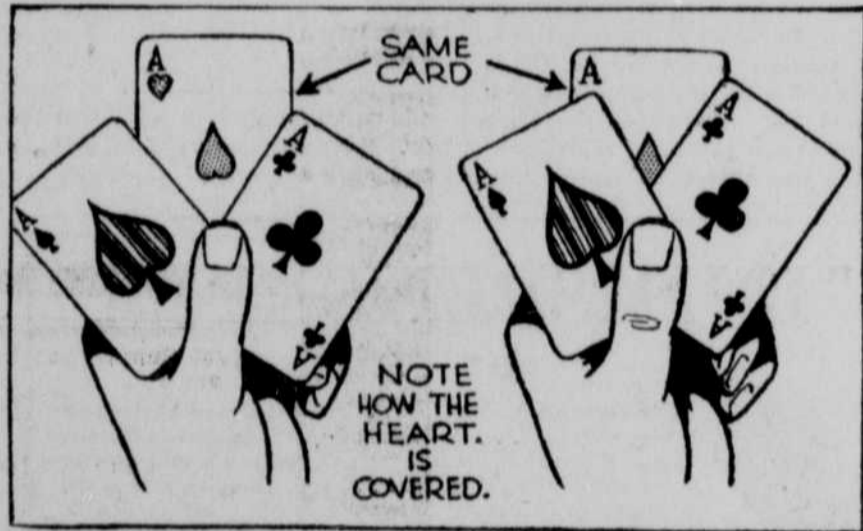

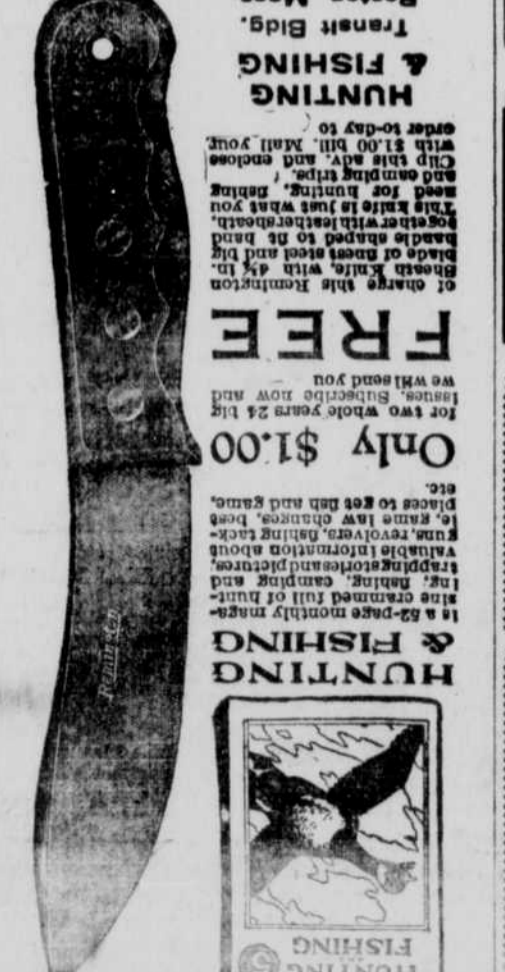
