emergency pasture plants and will undoubtedly be grown extensively over the state this year. Sudan is a hot weather crop and should not be sown until late corn planting time.

Early oats and barley will usually escape most of the grasshopper damage. Farmers in northern Nebraska lost these crops, however, last year because a late freeze delayed the crops and an unusually favorable spring hurried up the hatching of the grasshoppers.

Blue flour corn or squaw corn is thought by some farmers to be unpalatable to grasshoppers. First types of early corn will probably do better if the grasshoppers are bad than ordinary dent corn.

Alfalfa and clover which were eaten off last year should be given a chance to grow this spring and farmers

should wait until other land is planted before giving up hopes of the alfalfa or clover coming back.

Notice is hereby given that on the 5th day of April, A. D. 1932, at the regular polling places in said City, between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and seven o'clock P. M. there will be held a special election in said City, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the voters of said City of O'Neill, Nebraska, to-wit:

"Shall the City of O'Neill, Nebraska issue its bonds in the sum of Six Thousand Dollars, to be known as Water Bonds, for the purpose of obtaining money with which to purchase fire extinguishing apparatus, said bonds to be dated June 1, 1932; to be in denominations of \$500 each; to be numbered from No. 1 to No. 12; to be payable to bearer; to draw interest at the rate of four and one-half per centum per annum, payable annually; principal and interest of said bonds to be payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Holt County, Nebraska; all of said bonds to become due in twenty years from the date of issue; but payable any time after five years; each of said bonds to have attached coupons representing the annual interest due and said bonds to be executed on behalf of the City by its Mayor and attested by its City Clerk and the corporate seal of said City to be attached to the bonds but not to the interest coupons; And shall the proper officers of said City of O'Neill be authorized to annually levy and collect taxes in the same manner as other municipal taxes are levied and collected, in an amount sufficient to create a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds as required by law, and to pay the interest on said bonds as the same matures, on all taxable property within said City?"
