

**BRIEFLY STATED**

Surveyors have been busy for several days past surveying highway 281 from O'Neill south four miles to connect with the oiled road. We understand that this will be graded and oiled this fall, being included in the state's program of highway improvement.

On complaint of O. W. Sanders, Forest Hopkins, of Ewing, was arrested last week charged with having assaulted Hopkins on or about July 11. Hopkins appeared in county court last Tuesday morning, plead guilty and was fined \$10 and costs, a total of \$15.80.
