You name the amount as when and if you make the tender or shipment. We do not have the money in hand with which to pay you for the gold you offer. Whatever it amounts to, we shall have to borrow from our people the dollar exchange to hand to you for the gold you deliver to us. Since last Dec. 22, 1936, we have thus purchased (up to June 8, 1937) \$878,001,200.77. For this we have had to borrow with tax exempt interest bearing bonds.
