
Range Romance Lives Again in Musty Records







Uncle Sam Thorough in Training Sky Soldiers



Seeking to expand the number of its pilots to more than 4,500 in the next two years, the United States army is cautious in its training of sky soldiers. After three months initial training in nine civilian flying schools the students go to Randolph field, San Antonio, Texas, for another three months basic training. Here their mettle and fitness are tested. 1.-The photopolygraph determines muscular and brain co-ordination, respiration, reflexes and pulse. 2.—The primeter test for measuring the visual field of form and color is given. Eye defects and high blood pressure cause 45 out of 50 rejections. 3 .- The balancing chair determines the sense of equilibrium. 4.-Ground school teaches the cadet how to read maps, how his engine works, and other details. This, plus actual flying, readies the cadet for advanced work at Kelly field.
