and form ice on the telephone wires. About the same time, other sleet storms had developed in parts of Iowa, Minnesota and South Dakota and in some places there also was heavy snow. The weight of the ice on the telephone wires, coupled with falling temperatures and a strong wind, caused many telephone lines to break, cutting off about 200 cities and towns from telephone communication. This Company and its subsidiaries, the Tri-State and Dakota Central telephone companies, had more than 50 000 wire breaks and over 2,000 poles down in the territory in-

dicated on the above map. The telephone property loss of these companies was nearly \$200,000. This brings to more than \$3,000,000 the amount it has cost this Company and its two subsidiaries the last 10 years to repair property damaged or destroyed by storms. Restoration of telephone service interrupted by the November storm was accomplished in the usual manner.
