# **Government Restrictions** Affect Telephone Users

The telephone business is now operating under definite government orders restricting the installation and replacement of telephone equipment. Some of these restrictions are!

> L. Wall and desk telephones can not be replaced with hand telephones.

> 2. Extension telephones in residences can be installed only under certain circumstances.

> 3. Party-line service is the only service which can be provided in some localities for new applicants and for those who move.

4. Replacements and improvements, which under ordinary conditions could be made, now have to be deferred.

These restrictions will affect many telephone users but we shall do everything in our power to provide as adequate service as is possible under existing war conditions.
