
Dear Soldier:

To speed up dish drying, take a dry towel in each hand.

If the paint can has a deeply recessed edge, punch a few holes in the edge before starting to paint. The paint which usually collects on the top of the can will run back into the can instead of on the outside of can.

To prevent braided or crocheted rugs from rumpling up, cover the backs with wall paper. After you wash rugs, paste on the paper and let dry thoroughly.

Blind Man's Baseball Has Cables to Guide Players

A baseball game played by the blind has only five men on a team -pitcher, catcher and three basemen-and the "ball" is a threeinch metal ring strung on a waisthigh cable running from the catch-Barbara Bell Pattern No. 1763-B is designed for sizes 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42, 44 and 46. Size 34, short sleeves, requires batter strikes the pitcher ring, the basemen, standing in line behind the pitcher, try to grab and shoot it back to the catcher.


