**Important Notice To Employers And Workers**

Chairman McNutt, of the War Manpower Commission, announced "that priority manpower referral" will go into effect in all areas of the United States not later than July 1. This is a program which provides that no employer in any area may be permitted to hire male workers from among those referred by the United States Employment Service of the Manpower Commission or under arrangement with the United States Employment Service. The program does not include farm employers and farm workers. In northeast Nebraska the Norfolk War Manpower Com-

mission office will follow the procedure outlined by Chairman McNutt, but manpower controls in this area will not be as rigid as they will be in the industrial areas of acute labor shortage. The exact regulations to be followed in the Norfolk area will be determined by the War Manpower Commission in Norfolk at its meeting on June 19. Prior to July 1, the program for the Norfolk area will be announced in all weekly newspapers and over the radio. In stating the reasons for this additional manpower control, Chairman McNutt emphasized two important points. (1) The psychology of the country that the war will soon be over is resulting in the exodus of workers from essential to less essential activity. (2) The War Manpower commission must assume and meet the nation's demand for industrial manpower on a national basis. The shortage of manpower in one area which is delaying war production is a national problem.

Mr. A. Steffan, Area War Manpower Director, stated that his office is making arrangements for meetings to be held in numerous towns in northeast Nebraska to discuss war manpower problems and the new manpower controls as they affect each community. Interviewers from the Norfolk office are also calling on employers to explain the program.
