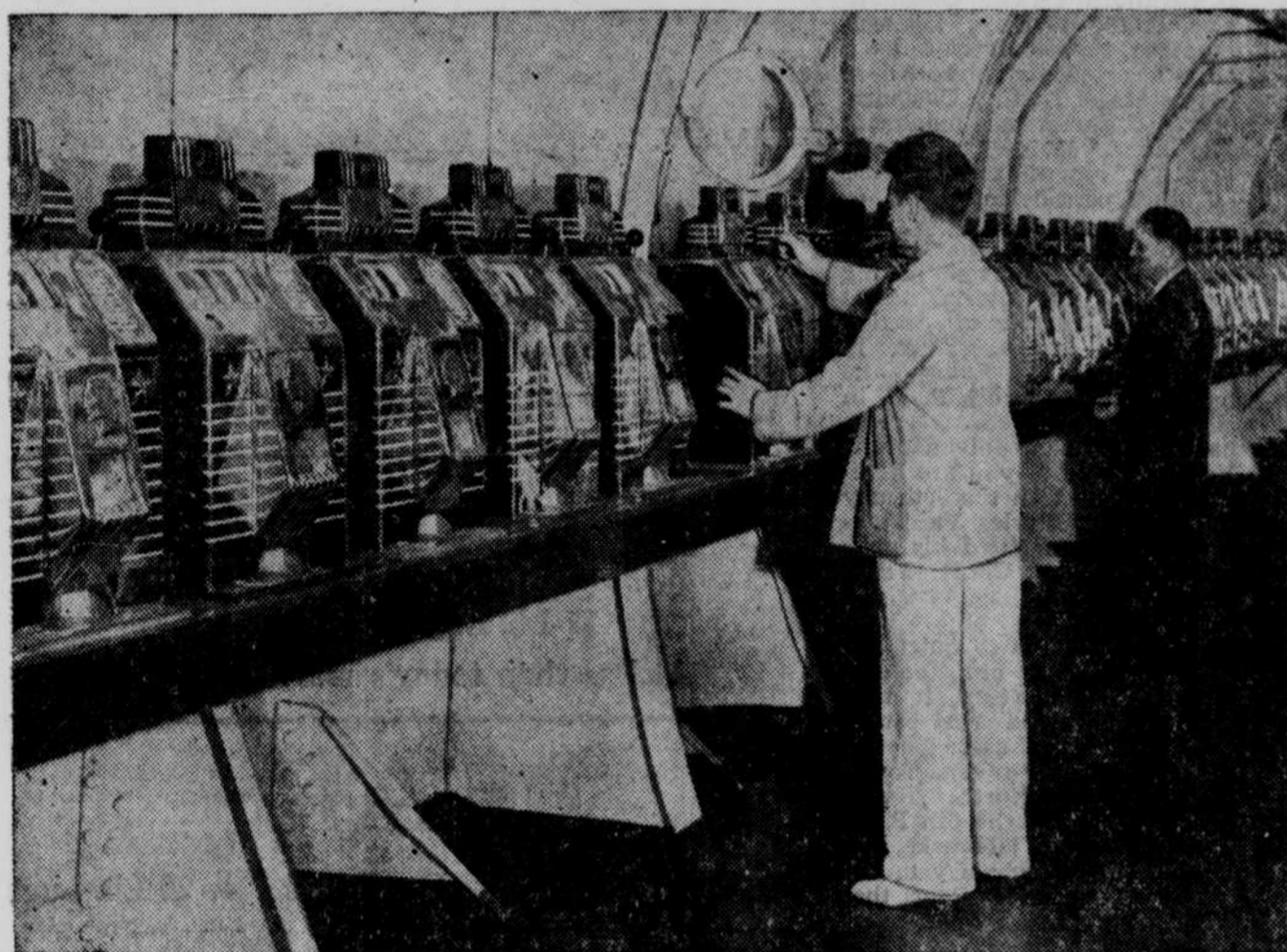

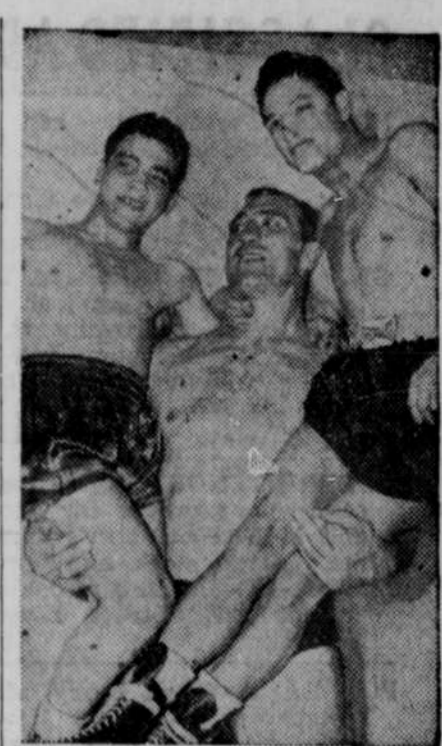

The original cubic inch of wheat planted by Hayden multiplied into a 2,660-acre crop in its sixth year.



**PROPOSED PEACE TERMS . . .** Area affected by the proposed treaties being considered at the Paris conference are shown on this map in black. Sites of territory on Italian-French border to France. Greece gets the Dodecanese islands from Italy, which also loses Libya. Pantelleria would be demilitarized. Albania would be recognized. Yugoslavia gets most of Venezia Giulia and Zara from Italy, and Trieste becomes a free territory. Romania gets Transylvania from Hungary, but it loses Bessarabia and N. Bukovina to Russia and S. Dobruja to Bulgaria. Finland loses Petsamo to Russia, but will get back Hangoe.

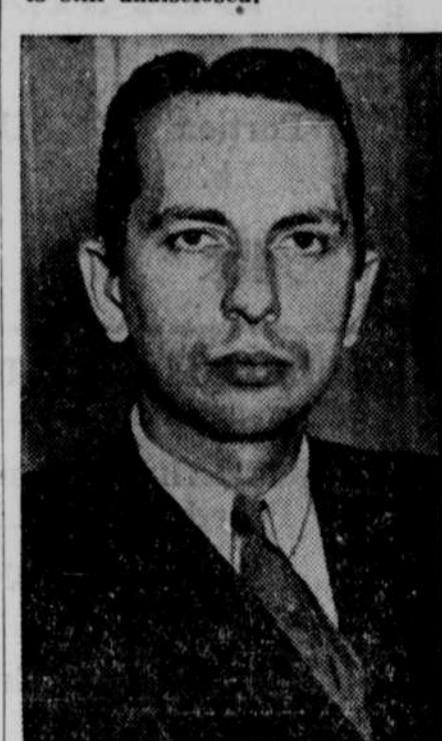
