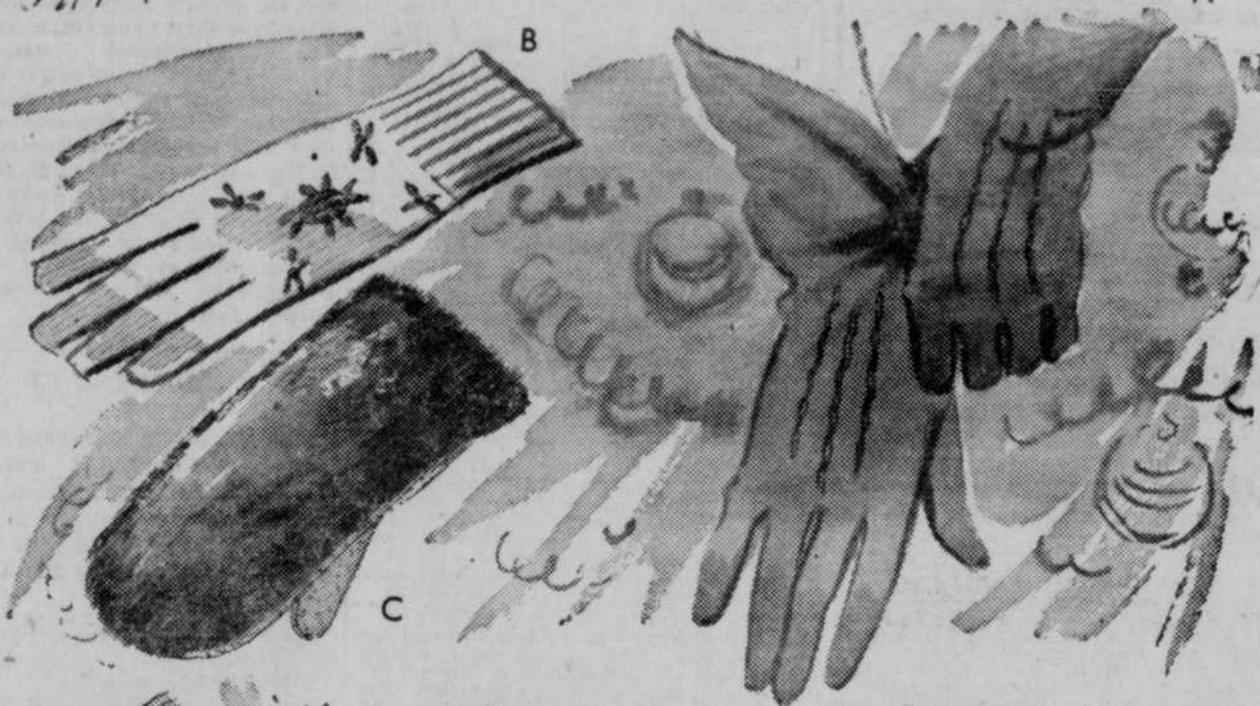
The plaintiff prays for a decree of foreclosure and sale of said premises, for the satisfaction of the lien of said taxes and costs and Attorneys fees.
