Schaffer Adds Story - Book Finish to West O'Neill

STUART — With the score knotted eight-all in the last-half of the ninth, Stuart's Keith Schaffer singled, stole second and third, and scored on a well-placed bunt to give his mates a 9-8 win over West O'Neill in a story book finish to a Holt-Boyd league game here Sunday.
